School is out for the summer in April and May in the Philippines. Like in the USA, that means it is time for Vacation Bible School. The parent church that we first helped Filipinos plant got quite serious about VBS. They ran five days of VBS at their home church, then spent the next five weeks holding VBS at the five outreach churches they planted for the tribes on the mountains. Here are a few photos of the children and their villages where the team served.

If you have been reading our prayer letters all along, you know how a whole village of Mangyans came down from the mountain and tried to settle in the lowlands among the Tagalogs to escape the crossfire between the Philippine army and the Communist rebels. We bought them land and told them they could build a new village there. We educated them, taught them hygiene, and most of all, taught them from the Scriptures. One member of the tribe is now a pastor and makes regular trips back to the mountains to teach the Word to the tribes still there. Another Mangyan just begun year one at a Bible college on the main island of Luzon.

Then, last month, another tribe showed up from the mountains, totally clueless about how to function in the developed Tagalog culture, and unaware that they could not just start building huts in any open space they found. We have purchased land for them. (It is quite cheap on the outer islands) We will get them educated and teach them the Word of God. We are excited to see where God takes this.

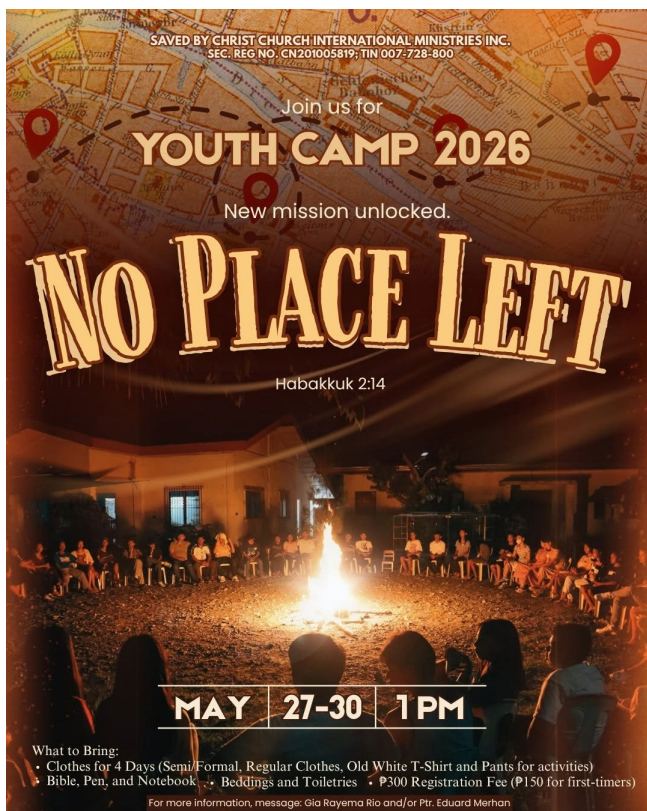

Summer Camp

(AS if they had not done enough already.)

You would think that after running six VBS programs, back to back, the team would want to stand down. Instead they setup and ran a Summer Camp for the older teens and young adults, the very next week after completing the last VBS. This involved cutting bamboo poles to build frames for sleeping quarters and climb to cut down palm branches to weave in to rain proof roofing materials. There were 91 participants plus camp staff that the ladies of the church had to feed by cooking three meals a day for the week. (Are you feeling convicted about the level of your service to reach others with the Truth yet? LOL)



The team did not purchase a packaged program as often happens in the USA. They created their own based on Habakkuk 2:14

The church certainly did their part over the seven weeks to work toward reaching that goal. They desire that there be “No place left” that has not heard the Truth found in Scripture.

Please consider helping us to help others. First let me tell you where donations to Timothy Mission do not go. They do not go to me. I live off of my pension. That is something like the Apostle Paul who made tents to support himself. The funds do not go to a denomination. The funds do not go to any of the big mission boards that extract as much as 30% from donations to one of there missionaries to support HQ. We are an independent ministry like many churches, thus out of being controlled by a mission board and their five year plans. Yet Through Central Missionary Clearinghouse we have financial accountability. They are simply that, a clearinghouse that, for a very small fee, makes the reports required by the IRS regarding how the funds received were used. CMC requires that each missionary they serve have three pastors that will send them a letter stating they will oversee the missionaries integrity and moral character.

So where do the donations go? 100% goes to the direct support of all the activities that you see in my prayer letters. Timothy mission contributes to the monthly income of six pastors because their congregations can not give enough to support them. There are transportation costs, supplies for the outreaches, church electric bills to be paid. We supply funds as needed for medical care to pastors and congregation members.
